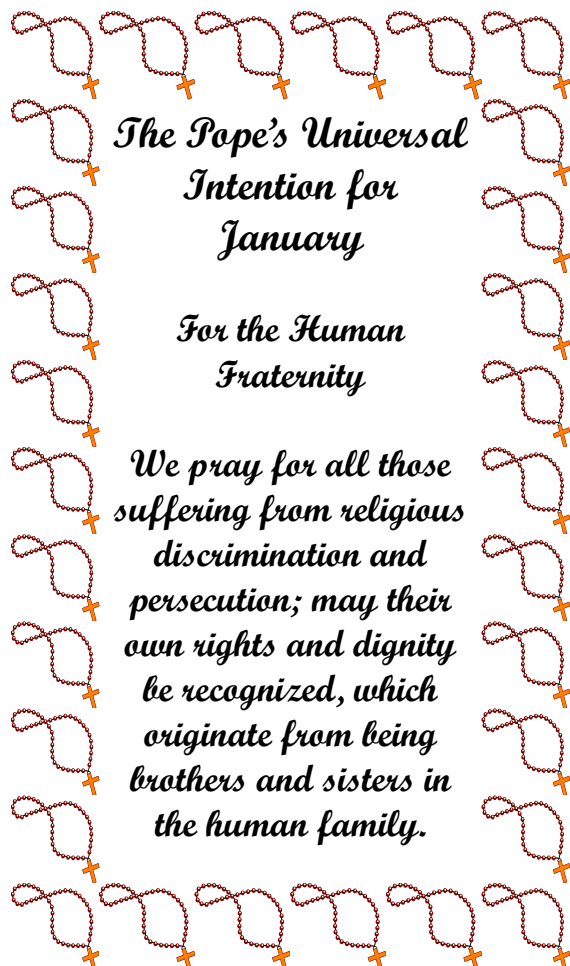

“He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit”

Now that’s a promise worth remembering: Jesus wants to baptize us with his own Holy Spirit! But what does that mean?

Let’s look first at Jesus’ experience of the Spirit. Luke tells us that at Jesus’ baptism, “the Holy Spirit descended upon” him(3:22). On that day, Jesus received the Spirit in a new way – a gift from God that would empower him and set him on the path of ministry, service, and ultimately death and resurrection. Though Jesus was already fully God, the Spirit of God still came upon him.

Luke includes a small but important detail in his account. As the Spirit descended on him, the Father called out, “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased” He spoke directly to Jesus. He told him how delighted he was in his Son’s obedience, humility, and trust in him. Baptized, or immersed in water, Jesus was also immersed in the Holy Spirit that day.

When you were baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon you and God claimed you as his beloved child as well. He entered into a new, unbreakable relationship with you and you became a new creation in Christ. But God doesn’t want to fill you with his Spirit only at your baptism. He wants to baptize you—immerse you—in his Spirit again and again so that you can be filled with his love and equipped for the work God has for you. Again and again, he wants to tell you, “You are my beloved child. I love you. I am pleased to have you in my family.”

Even if it has been decades since you were baptized, God still wants to fill you with his Spirit. So don’t be afraid to ask for more: more of his love, and more of his power in your life.
